## HISTORY CORNER

How many of you reading this can recall spending time in Beulah Lodge?

Aaron Napier, A Friends Pastor from New Castle, played a major role in the creation of camp. He was first married to Jennie, and they had one child in 1909. Unfortunately, their daughter Beulah passed away at the age of 7 in 1916.

In the spring of 1927, construction of the first building at Quaker Haven began. This beautiful lodge was named in memory of Beulah A. Napier. The three-story white lodge was constructed for multiple purposes. A dormitory space and kitchen area were the two important amenities, along with classrooms, sun porch, and crafts.

In 1979, Quaker Hall was established. This new facility replaced what was known as Beulah Lodge.
